

ROLLE AND CLINTON ESTATES

Much of the Eastern End (Chopes Bridge End) of the village was owned by the Rolle Estate, but in 1842 when John, Lord Rolle died without a direct heir the Estates were passed to his nephew Mark George Kerr Trefusis son the 19th Baron Clinton, and were absorbed into the Clinton Estates.

Most of these houses were occupied by workers on the Estate (including Forestry, Game- Keeping, Gardening) but were sold during the 1950's, 1960's and are now privately owned.

Some examples of the 1958 sale:-

1. Locks Beam Farm. 156a Or. Op rent £246 19s 3p
2. Southcott Farm. 142a 3r 30p rent £251 8s 8p. Mr. A. Ford. Well water. Own electric.
3. Three small allotment fields, let to Mr L.W. Trathen (£1 10s 1p pa). Mr. C. Edworthy (£4.0s 0p) and Mr A. Curtis (£2 0s 0p) rights of way to Van's wood over all properties.
4. Hazelwood Cottage. 601a Mrs A Danberry. £48 7s 2p
5. Two cottages known as no 1 & 2 Chopes Bridge Cottages
 1. Mr T.J. Wills £14 6s 0p
 2. Mr J. Martin £15 19s 0pBoth have bucket closets and mains water and electric.
6. A plot of land yard and building rented by Mr F.W. Martin, and Mr F. Southcombe.
£1 and £2 and a shed or barn used as a carpenter's shop.
